

Author interview


Daily10 recently interviewed Bhakti Mathur, the author of 'Amma, Tell Me About Holi'. She grew up in India but now lives in Hong Kong with her family. 'Amma, Tell Me About Holi' is her first children's book.

D10: Where does your interest in books and writing come from?

My love for books started from a very young age. My mother was a librarian and as a child I spent many hours in the library. I suppose books are great and inexpensive babysitters!


I had a nanny who was forever telling me tales from Indian mythology. They were the most fascinating of stories, and I used to get lost listening to them.

One of the first memories I have is 'Horton Hears a Who!' by Dr. Seuss being read to me by my mother while I sat in her lap. My love affair blossomed with Enid Blyton, the Nancy Drew series, Agatha Christie, Sherlock Holmes and JRR Tolkien. Then came MM Kaye, AJ Cronin, Daphne du Maurier, Somerset Maugham and I was hooked for life.



D10: What was it like for you to write 'Amma, Tell Me About Holi'?

It was fantastic; I loved every



minute of it! Other than the writing, I enjoyed researching the topic. It was a great learning experience.

D10: Where did you get the idea to write this book?

The idea for the 'Amma, Tell Me' series came as a way to introduce my older son, Shiv, to Indian mythology and festivals. And the name 'Klaka' came from Shiv himself. He came back

home from school one day and announced that 'Shiv' didn't cut it, and he should be henceforth be addressed as Klaka!

I am keen to introduce mythology tales to my kids. I grew up listening to them and loved it and want them to experience the same.

D10: What are your future plans as an author?

I have a series of four more books planned on Indian festivals which should keep me busy for the next year at least! The books are on Diwali (the Indian festival of lights), The Birth of Krishna, on Ganesha (the elephant God) and on the Goddess Durga.
